## Why Servant Leadership?

Luke 7:36-50 – Simon and his feast

- Simon, a proud Pharisee
- A woman (sinner) honors Jesus
- Jesus tells a story about a creditor (Himself) and two debtors (Simon & the woman)
- Who loved more?
- Who should we serve and honor?

## Worldly Leadership

- Subordinates
- Restricted information (need to know)
- People used
- Produce for the managers
- Motivation: Fear

#### Incarnational Leadership Model

14 You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. 15 No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you. 16 You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you. 17 These things I command you, that you love one another.

- Friends
- Shared information
- People developed
- Produce own fruit
- Motivation: Love



### Jesus the Servant

- He came not to show off his worth –
   He came to give us worth
- He came not to enrich Himself at our expense – He came impoverishing Himself to make us rich
- He came not to impress us with His glory - He came to share His glory with us

#### How Then Shall We Lead?

**6** (Jesus) who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, **7** but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. **8** And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross.

Philippians 2: 6-8 (NKJV)

#### How Then Shall We Lead?

Move in the opposite direction of your natural tendencies Lessons Jesus taught us about leadership:

- He would become the greatest became the least
- Whoever seeks to gain their life Must lose it in me
- Unless a seed falls into the ground and dies It cannot produce a harvest
- If someone seeks your coat Give him your cloak also
- The world says "love your friends" -Jesus says "love your enemies"

#### The Mission

24 But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God.

#### Holy Spirit – Comforter, Counselor, Paraclete

- Sent to us to complete the work of Jesus, to fulfill the mission.
- Paraclete means "one who comes alongside".
- Holy Spirit is our Heavenly mentor
- One who empower us to empower others
- One who leads us as we lead others to Jesus

#### Servant Leadership – Progressive Growth in Christ

Servant leadership requires the practice of certain disciplines. These disciplines are key elements of "abiding in Christ."

They are progressive in nature –

- Humility "apart from Him I can do nothing" leads me to:
- Seek Him and as He reveals Himself and what He is doing I can:
- Love Him by obeying and working with Him this will lead me to:
- Serve Him as I lovingly serve others this creates opportunities to:
- <u>Exalt Him</u> by giving Him the glory and to maximize my faithfulness:
- Accountability I ask others to hold me to these disciplines.
